Positive Momentum Building at Techne Center



Since Covid-19 came on the scene and 'work from home' became commonplace, the commercial real estate market has faced challenges. The Township has seen its share of buildings sit empty, only to be compounded by an oversaturated market and new norms of employee/business relationships. But, the purchase of the property at 1700 Edison Drive by the rapidly growing company TQL has set in motion a course of postive momentum at Techne Center.

1701 Edison Drive was the original location of TQL's headquarters when the young company was incubating. TQL, in fact, has never left and - with the purchase of the building at 1700 next door, they now own three buildings in Miami Township with close to 400 employees (there are 200 employees at their location on Allen Drive).

There are no immediate plans in place for the property. In the next year or two, as TQL wraps up projects in other communities, they will turn their attention back to the Edison Drive location. Miami Township is excited to have TQL in the community for another generation - or more, and we look foward to seeing what they will bring to Techne Center.



A neighboring property at 200 Techne Center Drive has recently been demolished. In terms of positive momentum - this is addition by subtraction. The

stucture was 42 years old and had been empty for years. The building was one of 13 purchased a year and half ago by a new group of owners. Office space is plentiful around the country, but there is a demand; and at Techne Center that demand is high. This is momentum because the owners are going to have plans in the future to do something new at the site.

While there is a lot of empty office space around all communities, it's the wrong kind of space. Many of the empty buildings are two or three generations old, they are not modern in their technology or what modern office spaces require, and they don't provide the experience new employees are wanting. We are very pleased the new owners are showing momentum and we believe the public will continue to see this trend. Miami Township is excited for what the future brings and for the investment in our community!

What to do After a Traffic Crash?

You've been in a traffic crash, now what?

Anytime you are in a crash, it is a stressful time. Here are the things you should do if you are involved in a traffic crash.

First and foremost is safety! Make sure you and the occupants of the

other vehicle are not injured. Be careful when outside the vehicle while in the roadway. If someone is injured, call 911 immediately.

Second, call the police for a report. You may not know what the local non-emergency number, don't worry, just call 911. Explain to the dispatcher that you were involved in a traffic crash. The dispatcher will ask you a series of questions and send an officer. If you'd like, add the non-emergency dispatch number to your contacts list so that you have it whenever you need it! 513-732-2231.


Next, if no one is injured and the damage is minor, move the vehicles to the side of the roadway or into a parking lot. In case they do decide to leave, make sure to note the license plate of the other vehicle involved prior to moving the vehicles. That will help identify them later, if needed.

If it is safe take some pictures, do so. However, if it is not safe, wait until the officer arrives. This is especially important on very busy roadways or highways.

If your car is disabled and cannot be moved, do not sit in it. Go to the side of the road, preferably get behind a guardrail or 10 to 15 feet from the edge of the road. Secondary crashes do happen!

The most important piece of advice is to file a crash report at the time of the crash. It can be very difficult to report a traffic crash after the fact. Witnesses are often no longer available, and it can be hard to determine who is at fault.

If you agree to exchange information at the time of the crash and not file a police report,

Watch out for School Buses and School Speed Zones!

Since summer is over and school is back in session, now is a perfect time to review school bus and school zone safety. There are many laws in the State of Ohio that help ensure our students

are safe as they travel to and from school.

One question police officers often hear in regards to school bus safety is, when is it ok, if ever, to pass a stopped school bus. Ohio Revised

Code 4511.75 clarifies this issue and is summarized by the graphic to the right.

It is also illegal to pass a stopped school bus on a private roadway – such as the road in an apartment complex.

It is important to note that Ohio Revised Code 4511.751 allows a police officer to take enforcement action based on a bus driver's observations, granted they are able to

provide a license plate, as well as accurate vehicle and driver description.

Statistics show that most traffic accidents involving school bus riders occur within 10 feet – in all directions – of the school bus. These areas are known as the danger zones, which is summarized by the below graphic:

Drivers should always use extreme caution near school buses – especially near the danger zones.

Drivers must also be aware that the speed limit for every school zone in Ohio is 20 MPH unless noted to be lower. The school speed zone is in effect as students arrive and depart the school day, as well as during recess hours. While most school zones are equipped with signs and flashing lights, a sign is all that is required.

A few additional ideas to consider with school back in session:

- DANGER ZONES

- Drivers should plan to leave a few minutes earlier than normal. Increased traffic and busses making multiple stops will increase your travel time.
- Slow down and be alert, especially when driving through neighborhoods. Drivers should be vigilant when school buses are present due to the likelihood of children walking near the roadway.

The Officers of Miami Township Police Department take the safety of our students very seriously whether they are in the classroom, out in the community, or when they are on the roadways getting to and from school. We wish all our students a great 2023-2024 school year!

Modern Day House Fires

Fire prevention is a big topic in our schools every October during Fire Prevention Month. Students come home with fun activities and fresh ideas about making their homes safe and protecting their families. We love the opportunity to make a positive impression on the young minds in our community and to help focus their thoughts on fire prevention and safety.

There are a few things that none of us have control over, but that are important to focus on when talking about home safety. First, the size of your house matters. More square footage means that fires can go undetected longer and grow more quickly. Homes today are 50% larger than they were just 50 years ago. Additionally, if you have a newer home (built in the last 10-15 years), the construction materials used in your house are much different than those that were used from the 1950's through the 1990's.

There are a lot more plastic-based and synthetic materials used to build and furnish your house today, which contribute to a fire's spread. These synthetic materials give off a lot more toxic smoke that can bank down quickly and overcome anyone inside at the time of the fire.


In a newer constructed home (2000's to present), **residents have an average of three minutes to escape from a house fire**. This is important to know because it illustrates the importance of not staying inside to rescue pets, collect valuables, or trying to extinguish the fire if it is already too large to control. Calling 9-1-1 early is the best thing you can teach your family, so Fire & EMS professionals can respond quickly for assistance.

As always, please call us at 513-248-3700 if you have any questions or need assistance with any emergency planning for your family.

- MAKE a home escape plan. Draw a map of your home showing all doors and windows. Discuss the plan with everyone in your home.
- KNOW at least two ways out of every room, if possible. Make sure all doors and window leading outside open easily.
- HAVE an outside meeting place (like a tree, light pole or mailbox) a safe distance from the home where everyone should meet.
- **PRACTICE** your home fire drill at night and during the day with everyone in your home, twice a year.
- PRACTICE using different ways out.
- **TEACH** children how to escape on their own in case you can't help them.
- CLOSE doors behind you as you leave.

IF THE ALARM SOUNDS...

- If the smoke alarm sounds, **GET OUT AND STAY OUT**. Never go back inside for people or pets.
- If you have to escape through smoke, GET LOW AND GO undert the smoke to your way out.
- **CALL** the fire department from outside your home.







A closed door may slow the spread of smoke, heat, and fire. Install smoke alarms inside every sleeping room and outside each separate sleeping area. Install alarms on every level of the home. Smoke alarms should be interconnected. When one smoke alarm sounds, they all sound.



According to an NFPA survey, only **one of every three** American households have actually developed and practiced a home fire escape plan.



While 71% of Americans have an escape plan in case of a fire, only 47% of those have practiced it.



One-third of American households who made an estimate thought they would have at least 6 minutes before a fire in their home would become life-threatening. The time available is often less. And only 8% said their first thought on hearing a smoke alarm would be to get out!

New Developments in Miami Township

You may have noticed some new development occurring around Miami Township. Here's an update on what is going on.


OPTIMA DERMATOLOGY FRAMED UP, SIDING NEXT

The Optima Dermatology building at the highly visible State Route 28 and Business 28 split is fully framed up and enclosed. We are looking forward to that important medical facility to open soon.



MILFORD MIDDLE SCHOOL STARTING NOW

The Community Development Office recently completed site plan review for the new Milford Middle School Building and campus. Initially we will see demolition of a few buildings (already occurring), to be followed up with the first phase construction which will consist of a Field House building containing locker rooms, concessions and gym space among other things in the new 32,500 square foot space. The Field House will also serve as the gateway into the Milford football stadium. Later stage work will include new parking areas, practice fields and improvements to the stadium. Lastly, the new middle school will be constructed, anticipated to begin construction in 2025.



EXPANSION AREA TO THE PROPERTY OF THE PROPERTY

KROGER EXPANSION ON TRACK

The site plan and zoning certificate have been approved for a 32,768 square foot expansion of the Mulberry Square Shopping Center Kroger store. This expansion has been in the works for several years and construction is now happening. The plans are for a Kroger Market Place including a new drive thru pharmacy and improved pickup parking. The Kroger re-investment has spurred at least one new tenant to locate to the center, Crumbl Cookie.



ALDI + ACCESS IMPROVEMENTS UNDER CONSTRUCTION

After several site iterations and development challenges, Aldi is now officially under construction. It will be located on State Route 28 opposite Kohls. Through extra planning by Miami Township, a new entry way into the adjoining Al Gore Acres Subdivision is being planned as part of the development. This will allow residents there to not only easily access Aldi, but also to avoid the challenging entrance to that subdivision off of State Route 28. They will now be able to safely enter the roadway via the light controlled access point serving Aldi.

TIRE DISCOUNTERS/CARRIAGE CARWASH GRADING ONGOING

Also in the Kohls vicinity, directly east on State Route 28, substantial grading is underway for a proposed Carriage Car Wash and new Tire Discounters. The property is already owned by Tire Discounters, which also now owns the Carriage Carwash brand.

With fall quickly approaching, leaves will soon be on the ground. Residents can play an important role in maintaining proper stormwater runoff by minimizing obstructions. Please do not place leaves or grass clippings in or near ditches, storm drains, culvert pipes, or the street. When stormwater cannot drain properly, flooding and

road damage can occur. Please do not burn leaves. The Township does not offer curbside leaf pickup. Residents can dispose of leaves either by composting them or by obtaining brush vouchers at the Miami Township Service Department, Civic Center, or Police Department Monday through Friday 8:00 AM - 4:00 PM. The vouchers allow residents to drop off biodegradable yard waste at Bzak Landscaping, which is located at 931 Round Bottom Road.

Proof of Miami Township residency is required to obtain the free brush vouchers. Each voucher is valid for one
