## Building Connections & Laying Groundwork

Miami Township has identified economic development as a key priority through the Township's strategic planning process. Over the past year, the Township has continued to build on that work by focusing on relationship-building, community engagement, and the development of a long-term strategy to guide economic growth.

Economic development efforts during this time have centered on gaining a stronger understanding of the Township's business environment and strengthening connections with key stakeholders. This has included outreach to local business owners, developers, brokers, school districts, and regional partners, along with coordination across Township departments. These efforts have helped provide a clearer picture of existing strengths and future opportunities.



### LISTENING TO OUR COMMUNITY •••

A significant portion of the year was dedicated to engagement and outreach. Township representatives attended chamber events, community gatherings, and ribbon cuttings, while also meeting directly with businesses throughout the community.

The Township also continued its coordination with regional partners such as REDI Cincinnati, as well as local school districts, to better understand workforce needs and opportunities for future collaboration. In addition, staff conducted a detailed review of business corridors, available properties, and current

development activity. This work helped identify areas where reinvestment may be supported and where future growth may occur.

As part of this effort, the Township's partnered with Retail Strategies to gain a deeper analysis of the local retail market. This included evaluating existing businesses, identifying gaps in services, and exploring opportunities to attract retail establishments that align with the needs of Township residents.

### CREATING A PATH FORWARD •••

Building on this work, Miami Township is in the process of finalizing a comprehensive economic development strategy. This strategy will serve as a framework to guide future decision-making and support thoughtful, balanced growth.

The development of the strategy has included input from business owners, community stakeholders, developers, and regional partners. That feedback will help ensure that the final plan reflects the priorities of the community while positioning the Township to compete for future investment opportunities.

The Township has also established a Community Improvement Corporation (CIC), providing an additional tool to support development projects, facilitate partnerships, and encourage strategic investment.

## Building Connections & Laying Groundwork (Continued)

### SUPPORTING OUR LOCAL BUSINESSES •••

Over the past year, a strong working relationship has been established with the Small Business Development Center (SBDC), providing new opportunities to connect local businesses with valuable resources. These services include one-on-one advising, assistance with financing, marketing support, and guidance for long-term growth.

The Township has also implemented a Business Retention & Expansion program to maintain regular communication with local employers, better understand their needs, and respond with appropriate support.

### LOOKING AHEAD •••

The past year has focused on building a strong foundation for economic development in Miami Township. Through continued engagement, detailed analysis, and strategic planning, the Township is well-positioned to support future growth and investment.

As these efforts move forward, residents can expect continued focus on strengthening the local business community, attracting new investment, and supporting redevelopment opportunities that align with the character and needs of Miami Township.

Economic development is a long-term effort, but the progress made over the past year represents an important step toward achieving those goals.

## Community Alert: Recent Scams Targeting Our Residents

The Miami Township Police are alerting residents to an increase in reported scams affecting members of our community.

These incidents are part of broader national trends, but they are happening here and targeting our most vulnerable residents.

Below are some of the most common scams our detectives are currently investigating:

(1) Impersonation Scams (*Police, IRS, or Utility Companies*): Scammers are contacting residents by phone or email, claiming to be law enforcement officers, government

agencies, or utility providers. They often create a sense of urgency; threatening arrest, service shutoff, or fines unless immediate payment is made. **No legitimate agency will demand payment via gift cards, cryptocurrency, or wire transfer.**

(2) Family Emergency Scams: Victims receive calls from someone pretending to be a grandchild or relative in distress, asking for money for bail, medical bills, or travel. These scams rely on emotional pressure and secrecy. **Always verify the situation by contacting another family member before taking action.**

(3) Tech Support Scams: Pop up messages or unsolicited calls claim your computer has been compromised. Victims are instructed to grant remote access

or pay for unnecessary “repairs.” **Legitimate tech companies will not contact you this way.**

### How to Protect Yourself

- Never send money or provide personal information to unsolicited callers or messages.
- Take your time - scammers rely on urgency.
- Verify requests independently using known, trusted contact information.
- Talk to family members, especially seniors, about these tactics.

Scammers are becoming more sophisticated, but awareness remains our best defense. By staying informed and looking out for one another, we can reduce the impact of these crimes in Miami Township.

## E-Bike Safety and Regulations: What You Need to Know

E-bikes have rapidly become the transportation method of choice for teenagers, offering a fun and convenient way to get around. However, that freedom comes with responsibility. When young riders don't know or choose not to follow local and state regulations, a quick trip can easily become a safety hazard.

E-bike usage has surged over the past years on township trails, streets, and parks—particularly among younger riders. To keep everyone safe, Miami Township Police Department and trail advocates are urging compliance with the following rules and safety guidelines.

### Knowing the Rules of the Road

In Miami Township, how and where you ride matters:

- **Sidewalks:** E-bikes are permitted on sidewalks *only if the motor is turned off*.
- **Streets:** When riding on the street, e-bikes must operate under standard motor vehicle laws. This means riders must come to a complete stop at stop signs and use proper hand signals.
- **Trail Restrictions:** E-bikes are allowed in Township parks if the motor is turned off. Furthermore, gas-powered vehicles and dirt bikes are banned on township park paths.
- **Speed & Age Limits:** By law, an e-bike's motor cannot exceed 20 mph. Under current regulations, individuals under 18 are prohibited from operating e-bikes capable of reaching speeds of 28 mph or more.

### Shared Trails and Pedestrian Safety

Increased speeds have led to a rise in community complaints. Social media users have frequently called out young e-bike riders for speeding down trails and in parks without regard for pedestrians. The township wants to emphasize the importance of being predictable, maintaining safe speeds, and giving others plenty of space to pass.

### Proactive Safety Tips for Riders

Crashes at high speeds can result in serious injuries, making helmet use non-negotiable.

Riders should follow these safety protocols:

- **Gear Up:** Always wear a helmet, protective glasses, and safety gear.
- **Mount Safely:** Always mount the e-bike with the motor turned off and the brakes fully engaged.
- **Account for Weight:** Because e-bikes carry additional weight, they gain momentum quickly. Exercise extreme caution when traveling downhill or navigating tight turns.
- **Communicate:** Learn and use clear hand signals to indicate when you are turning, starting, or slowing down.

A Note for Parents: Choosing the right bicycle model and ensuring proper parental supervision are critical to keeping young riders free from harm.

## Equipment Weight

Miami Township Fire & EMS personnel are cross-trained as both firefighters and paramedics, responding each day to a wide range of emergencies spanning both fire and medical needs. One of the most common questions we hear from the community is, “How much does your gear weigh?”

Think of fire trucks as rolling toolboxes and ambulances as mobile emergency rooms. Each carries a variety of tools and equipment, and when crews arrive on scene, they quickly decide what to bring to manage emergencies.

On medical calls, heavy protective gear isn’t needed, but crews still carry essential equipment, including a cardiac monitor, an EMS bag stocked with medications and medical devices, and an oxygen cylinder. This equipment can weigh 40-60 pounds.



During fire incidents, firefighters wear personal protective equipment (PPE) that includes pants, a coat, a helmet, boots, and gloves, along with a self-contained breathing apparatus, often referred to as an “Air Pack”. They also carry additional tools, such as a hand tool and a thermal imaging camera, to work safely in hazardous environments. Altogether, this gear can weigh 50-70 pounds or more.

When you see your community firefighters and paramedics, remember they’re carrying a wide range of equipment, often weighing dozens of pounds, to be ready for any situation.

## More Access for Miami Township

The Department of Community Development is in the midst of taking steps to ease and increase access to information involving the department's functions and activities. In recent months, the staff has consolidated the meeting schedules into a single document (including file / deadline dates, dates to set cases, and dates to hear zoning cases), updated application form and fee schedule information,

and has added this information and previous planning documents to the Township website. In the next couple of months, there will be several more conspicuous changes—including a new online permit portal to submit permits and public hearing applications—as well as a new look to the Department's website, which will include an area of the site that will contain all new zoning cases requiring public hearings as well as information about ongoing or recent cases of interest in the community (such as First Watch, Wawa, Speedway, the Ember multi-family project on Montclair Blvd., the Conrad multi-family project on Business 28, the Grove Park Subdivision, the Miami Reserves Subdivision, the Stillbrook Subdivision, the Villas at Meadowside, Trailside Estates, etc.). The staff also intend to prepare "long form" applications for permit submittals.

These long forms will simply be the existing application (along) with step-by-step instructions as well as example plot plans or site plans with a checklist of all required items. Making information more accessible and documentation easier to follow is a major priority to the staff and benefits all!

## Sidewalks Being Planned & Built

With the demolition of the former Milford Preschool structures on Business 28 set to take place in the next couple of months, members of the community will notice that a new 7-foot wide sidewalk is being added along all of the old school property's frontage (see the yellow highlighted area below) as a part of this effort—with the majority of the funding covered as part of the demo grant. As this work is taking place, Township staff is applying for other grant funds to complete sidewalk replacement and expansion improvements, so that a 7-foot sidewalk will soon be in place from Highview Drive to Wolfpen Pleasant Hill Road along the south side of Business 28. These improvements represent a small part of the Township's plans to build upon and expand the community's sidewalk and trail system(s).

## Project Updates

**Road Improvement Program** - R.A. Miller continues to replace curb and repair basins in Miami Trails Subdivision. They have completed White Gate Subdivision, Mitchell Farms Subdivision, Beauregard Ct, and Monticello Ct.

**Dry Run Retaining Wall** - UES has completed the test bores. UES is working on the geotechnical design solution for remediation and/or repair of the problem area. The Service Department has been working with Clermont County Engineer for review and possible funding.

**Sidewalks** - Miami Township has several different sidewalk projects in various stages of planning, design, or preparing bid packets. These projects are to provide pedestrian connectivity throughout Miami Township. Here are a couple locations: Business 28, Meijer Drive, and Loveland Miamiville Road.

**Spring Clean Up Days** - There was a total of 1,419 vehicles with 211.38 tons of garbage, 12,960 lbs of steel, 400 gals of used oil, and 36,000 lbs of paper shredding collected.

**Happy Hollow Landslide Repair** - The Township has partnered with Clermont County for a retaining wall project on Happy Hollow Road. Due to funding cycles with OPWC the project was bid this year. The contractor is planning for the project to begin in July.

## Brush Vouchers

Miami Township residents can drop off tree limbs and brush at Bzak Landscaping year-round. Bzak Landscaping is located at 931 Round Bottom Rd. They will accept all limbs and brush from Miami Township residents at no charge who present a free voucher.



The vouchers are available at the Miami Township Civic Center, Miami Township Service Department, or at the Miami Township Police Department between the hours of 8:00 am and 4:00 pm, Monday-Friday.

Proof of residency is required to obtain a voucher. One voucher is required per load. There is no limit to the amount of vouchers issued per resident. Please contact the Service Department at (513) 248-3728 with any questions.

## Field Status Hotline

To check the status of athletic fields at Township parks, call the Field Condition Hotline at (513) 248-5513. It is important to not play on the fields when they are closed. This will help to eliminate extensive maintenance to damaged fields. Also, the Township does not allow non-employees to maintain ball diamonds.
